b. ALTHOUGH I ENJOYED MYSELF AT THE PARTY, THERE WEREN'T MANY PEOPLE.

# 3. Find the question:

WHO PASSED THE EXAM? Peter did. He got a very good mark.

#### 4. Pronoun:

I saw Jane at the party. Jane saw me at the party.

JANE AND I SAW EACH OTHER/ONE ANOTHER AT THE PARTY.

# 5. Simple present or continuous:

This week I AM WORKING 9 hours a day but I normally WORK 8 hours.

# 6. Habit in the past:

When I was little, I went swimming twice a day = WHEN I WAS LITTLE, I USED TO GO SWIMMING TWICE A DAY.

# 7. Simple past or continuous:

We WERE EATING when suddenly the telephone RANG. (eat, ring)

## 8. Future forms:

A: 'Jane and I are going to the cinema tomorrow afternoon. Would you like to come?'

B:' Good idea! Yes, I'LL come. What time ARE you MEETING / ARE you GOING TO MEET?'
